

EOSINOPHILIC ESOPHAGITIS (EoE)

Eosinophilic esophagitis (EoE) is a chronic, inflammatory disease characterized by high levels of mast cells and eosinophils (two types of immune system cells) in the esophagus (muscular tube connecting the mouth to the stomach). This study will test whether AK002 can reduce eosinophils in the blood and the tissue of the esophagus and help improve symptoms. **If you have been diagnosed with, or think you may have EoE, you may be eligible for this study.**



If you experience symptoms like:

- Difficulty swallowing
- Painful swallowing
- Feeling like food is stuck after swallowing

You may have Eosinophilic Esophagitis (EoE)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE

Females and males, age 12 to 80 years old who have a confirmed diagnosis of EoE AND/OR have difficulty swallowing or discomfort when swallowing

- Qualified participants will receive drugs, lab tests and medical care related to the study at no cost
